- Progress toward the completion of 155 identified tasks has been reviewed and reported.
- The status of each task and milestone has been reviewed and updated to reflect progress.



Q2 Progress Report: Council Highlights

- 20 decisions impacted plan progress
- 24 scheduled meetings to host by Council
- 55 Council meeting invites were in the Council Calendar
- 11 meetings in the Council Calendar were Indigenous focused
- 12 times Council advocated to other levels of government
- 18 proclamations were made
- \$2.08M net new capital funding was approved

- A consolidated internal summary of municipal health initiatives was completed.
- Flood regulations are being prepared for inclusion in an updated Land Use Bylaw
- FireSmart Home Rebate Program was launched.

- Accepting nominations of local Indigenous athletes, community builders and local legends to be part of a travelling Indigenous Sports Gallery.
- KAIROS Blanket Exercise was facilitated by Elder Cleo Reece.
